### WHAT TO EXPECT FROM YOUR VISIT WITH PSP . . .

#### Directions:

##### *From the west (Airport):*

I-376 East leads to the Fort Pitt Tunnel and Bridge. Stay right on I-376 East to exit 71A on left for Grant Street.

##### *From the south:*

Route 19 and Route 51 lead to the Liberty Tunnel and Bridge. Exit at Forbes Avenue to Grant Street.

##### *From the east:*

I-376 (the Parkway East) leads to downtown Pittsburgh. Exit at Grant Street.

##### *From the north:*

I-279 leads to I-579. Exit at Sixth Avenue to reach Grant Street.
